Our Foundation Phase classes made cards which were delivered to Deeside Community Hospital Dementia Ward this week by Mrs Duggan and they were very well received by everyone there - this is something that we will make a tradition by doing it each year.

Thank you so much for your generous support for the Shoebox Appeal. You managed to donate 10 shoeboxes, which at this time of year and with the economic hardships we are all suffering, is a spectacular effort.
