I would like to congratulate Abigayil Miller on her recent election to Chair of Governors of St Ethelwold's VA School. The pupil was airlifted to Alder Hey hospital, where they remain in a stable condition and we await news of when they will return to school. This accident was devastating for the family, who, under the most harrowing pressure, have managed to remain strong, courageous and positive and I know that they have appreciated the support from you, the parents of pupils from St Ethelwold's.

We were amazed by the response from the emergency services, particularly the Welsh Air Ambulance - an organisation which does not receive any government funding and relies entirely on voluntary donations and support - and as such we will be holding a charity event for them, details of which are below:

Safeguarding at St Ethelwold's

All staff have been trained in Safeguarding procedures and it is timely to remind you of how we ensure your children are always safeguarded in school:

Safeguarding is the action that is taken to promote the welfare of children and protect them from harm.

Safeguarding means:

- ·Protecting children from abuse and maltreatment
- ·Preventing harm to children's health or development
- Ensuring children grow up with the provision of safe and effective care
- •Taking action to enable all children and young people to have the best outcomes.

Child protection is part of the safeguarding process. It focuses on protecting individual children identified as suffering or likely to suffer significant harm. This includes child protection procedures which detail how to respond to concerns about a child.

All staff at St Ethelwold's VA School are highly trained in Safeguarding Procedures and are vigilant at all times to any Safeguarding concern
